It's a Fact!

Some years ago, there was a burglary in the office of the Zoo in Detroit, U.S.A. and the safe was completely emptied. The Zoo could not afford another new safe, so the Director decided at the end of each day to place the money-box in the lions' cage.

The strangest meat course ever to be served at a banquet, was in Paris in 1931. The meat was mammoth and 20,000 years old, a present to France from Russia where it had been found deep frozen in the tundra. It was one of the courses given at a banquet for Zoologists. The meat tasted very fresh, but was a little tough, which is not to be wondered at!

There is only one plant which animals will not eat, and this is the Palma Christi (*Ricinus communis*). Even insects avoid the place where it grows. This is the plant from the seeds of which, castor oil is obtained.

An elephant seal consumes about 75 kilos of fish per day. It would seem that this is an enormous appetite, but there are also other creatures of quite a different size and weight, which also eat enormously – for instance, the graceful swallow eats daily 500–600 flies and other insects!

If all the newspapers delivered during the course of one day the world over, were laid one on top of the other, there would be a tremendous heap. They would be higher than Mount Blanc, which is 4,810 meters high.
